The club has many charities it supports, and the major fundraiser is their very impressive book shed. I was lucky enough to visit the book shed on the next day, thank you John Nash for the tour and PDG Ken Hall for pointing out all of the Rotary Projects in the area. Tamworth supports School of St Jude, Blaze Aid, Smith Family, Lifeline, Ronald McDonald House and provides BBQ for the camp draught. They support the breakfast club at the High School and provide and award for TAFE students. PDG Ken Hall took me to the High School where YEP students from over the year here either had a brick in the path or a tree planted in the grounds in their honour. BUSHFIRE RELIEF FUND UPDATE

DG BUSHFIRE RELIEF FUND - \$164k AVAILABLE

The responses to the bushfire Relief Fund and its effect on affected districts has been remarkable. We have distributed a significant amount of funding to 6 bushfire relief projects that were set up and in some cases covered two or three districts.

We had set aside funding that our original intention was to match these funds with global grants. We received 4 applications before the foundation Shut off access to global grants.

Accordingly, we have decided that the funding we have available should be used for matching grants with clubs and districts who wish to run Programmes that will assist in the rehabilitation of both victims and areas affected by the bushfires. There is approximately \$164,000 available and calling for applications from clubs and districts who wish to match their programmes with a grant.

The criteria are that the programme must assist with rehabilitation in a bushfire affected area and will need to have a RAWCS project number.

Applications will be received by me up to 15th September and then considered by the committee.
